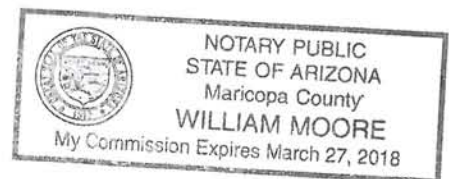

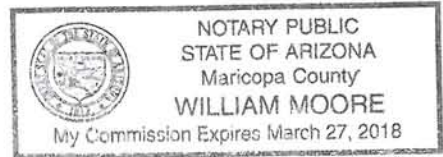

ATTACHMENT A

"Real Poker Pizza Party" - A Private Entertainment Event

Arizona's amusement gambling exclusion prohibits "offering prizes as a lure" (A.R.S. 13-3301.C). Net proceeds from this event, if any, are added to the prize pool and distributed to the winner(s).

In two places on the Attorney General's Registration Form, the word "prizes" replaces the word "product" as used in ARS 13-3311: (1) The "name and description of the prizes to be awarded" and (2) The "purchase price of the prizes to be awarded".

ARS 13-3311.A.2. is the only place that the value of the prizes is asked for, and only then for the the minimum dollar amount of all prizes to be awarded. By establishing a minimum value for the prizes, it is implied that the final established value of the prizes may be greater than advertised. This does not add an increment to the price of the product, as shown in the projections below.

The prize pool, entry fees, and event-related overhead all comprise "part of the established purchase price for the product". The "purchase price", or "value", of any "product" is established by the formula $R-O=V$. Revenue less Overhead equals the product's fair market Value, or "established purchase price". The projected "established purchase price for the event product" is shown below.

The "money paid to gamble" consists of participating Club member's \$100 entry fees.

Increasing the prize pool to achieve a net zero balance for the Event ensures that "no increment has been added to the price in connection with the gambling event" (13-3301.d.iii), and that "no increment has been added to the established purchase price for the product in connection with the gambling event" (ARS 13-3311.C), and that "no increment has been added to the established purchase price for the product in connection with the gambling event." (13-3311.C.6).

Amusement gambling poker tournaments (AGPTs) do not trigger the poison pill clause of the tribal-state gaming compact, which allows for gambling that was legal prior to 2003 compacts.

The lure analysis fails when there is no profit or private inurement.

Examples of Event "Established Purchase Price" with "No Increment" added:

This is the "established purchase price" for the "event product", based on the final number of entries. No increment is added to this valuation, to be established at the start of the tournament. Whether 6 entries or 46, the event product's value remains unchanged from start to finish.
